Language Arts

News and information: Students are reading two anchor texts this quarter, <u>The Lightning Thief</u> and <u>Wonder</u>. They should finish both books by October 14th. The Lighting Thief is being read in class. Wonder should be read independently in class and at home.

We are working on literary skills such as identifying central ideas, identifying themes, analyzing character choices and plot events, and supporting analysis with text evidence. We also read informational texts that pair with our two novels.

Students are learning how to write a narrative story which includes descriptive details, effective pacing and transitions, dialogue, conflict, and resolution. Students are learning to use proper conventions and grammar in their writing.

6th graders engage in speaking and listening through whole group and small group discussions. The unit will culminate with students writing their own hero's journey narrative.

During the second quarter, we will read The Giver by Lois Lowry and start argumentative writing.
