Principal Message

Skyhawks Families,

This past week, our team has made some significant progress toward our return to in-person learning plan. The purpose of this communication is to provide more context to questions you asked in the past regarding our learning plan. Let me start by saying that while these decisions have been collaborative, no plan would honor or capture all of the voices. However, I think it is important to name that we listened and worked together to create a plan that ensures equity in learning for all of our kids in our school community.

As mentioned last week, families will receive personal communication via School Messenger to their email regarding your students' cohort beginning next week. All families should verify their email in Parent Portal as soon as possible. All students at Hill have been cohorted in order to know which days they will receive live instruction with their teachers. Again, this will be communicated to each family via School Messenger. Families will also begin to see new schedules in Parent and Student Portal starting next week. One significant change that all families should note is that our in-person students will NOT begin until Monday, October 26th. This allows us to start our in-person instruction on a Monday instead of the middle of the week. Additionally, October 23rd will be an asynchronous day for all students. This day will be focused on teacher training for the return to in-person. There will be no live instruction.

Moving forward, our school day will start at 7:50 am and dismiss beginning at 2:15 pm. All in-person students will finish dismissing at 2:30. Stay tuned for more directions on drop off and pick up locations for in-person students.

Students in our MI classroom who have selected in-person will be in school M-F for in-person instruction and begin on October 21st. Virtual students in our MI classes will have access to live instruction each day. If you have questions about MI instruction, please reach out to your child's teacher. If your child receives transportation per their IEP, please contact transportation for route information by calling 720 423 4699.

What can your student expect based on your Virtual or In-person Selection:

In-person students (Cohorts A or B):

Will report to school on the days that align with their cohort.

Will have two days of in-person live instruction and two days of asynchronous work (independent work that aligns with what they learned in class).

Fridays will be virtual live instruction.

Virtual Students (Cohorts A or B):

Will stream into class on days that align with their cohort.

Will have two days of streaming live instruction and two days of asynchronous work (independent work that aligns with what they learned in class). Fridays will be virtual live instruction.

While we know a teacher can't be replaced with independent work, we are forced to think of school differently this year without attempting to recreating what we have done in the past. Asynchronous work is independent work that will focus on students practicing skills that they are learning in their streamed or in-person instruction. Tasks are aligned to standards and will support students in demonstrating mastery of grade-level standards. Students may also work on long-term projects and explore topics that are not related to content that they are learning in school.

As I mentioned, there is no right way to make these shifts as we return to in-person, and I know that there are mixed emotions about where we landed. That is true for me too. However, every time I think, well, maybe we should have done something different, another road black or reason why it would not work, becomes apparent. As your school leader, I can say that I believe at the core of who I am as an educator that this plan and our teachers will accelerate all students despite us "doing" school differently.
